DECEMBER 18th, 2025, SPECIAL MONTHLY MEETING  
GLYNDON COMMUNITY CENTER

**Meeting Minutes:**

Members present were Fred Kuehl, John Winter, Ed Dorsett, Angie Kuehl and Justin Thompson. Fred called the meeting to order at 7:04PM.

The minutes from November's meeting were reviewed. Fred made a motion to accept these minutes. Ed seconded the motion. The minutes were accepted.

The Treasurer's Reports (Balance Sheet and Profit Loss YTD Comparison) were reviewed. John made a motion to accept the financial reports. Fred seconded the motion. The financial reports were accepted.

**Old Business:**

- Federal Land Trust on the property West of HWY 336.
  - Payton Mastera updated the council on a few items regarding the potential trust land. He stated that the largest hurdle the tribe will encounter if they build a casino on the land is getting utilities to the site. He also mentioned that Glyndon Township signed an annexation agreement in 2005, thus, the County will not need to go through a formal annexation process to acquire the property. Finally he brought up that the county would have to find a way for the tribe to get access to a casino; there is a lot of speculation on how this would be accomplished (one option may be to get a 14th street overpass).
  - There were no decisions made. The conversation was tabled until next month.
- Solar Power in the Township -
  - Frits Ebinger (Developer with Nokomas Power), Curt and Blain joined the meeting to further discuss having solar in our township.
  - The conversation revolved around whether or not the solar will positively or negatively impact the soils, scenery, and economic well being of the township.
    - Frits and Curt brought up the benefits of the solar in the township
      - This project is on 19.73 Acres of land
      - Nokomas Energy uses a pollinator friendly seed which should improve the soil quality by introducing organic matter to the soils.
      - The county requires a bond to remove all infrastructure and bring the property back to natural state after the project is completed.
      -
    - Ed, John, and Blain brought up how it is negatively impacting other communities
      - 12 of the neighbors John talked to are against the project.
      - Although Federal Funding is being cut for solar projects, according to Frits, this project isn't contingent on those funds.
  - The supervisors agreed that the entire township should get a say on Solar in the Township. It was decided that Justin should add this to the annual meeting agenda. This issue is tabled until the Annual Meeting.

- MAT Annual Conference is coming up in December. No action Taken

**New Business:**

- LRID Grant - 4th Ave Northeast and 60th St North Improvement Project
  - Peyton Mastera, City Administrator for Dilworth, MN petitioned the council to sign a resolution in support of the project.
  - The project will pave the road for a new community center. The supervisors reviewed and discussed the Resolution. Fred made a motion to sign the Resolution. Ed seconded the motion. John signed the resolution. The motion passed.
- Noxious weed Update.
  - Ed will update the contact for the noxious weed representative. He will take Kevin's name off and get his name added.
- John Winter seeks to be re-elected this year for township supervisor. Justin will put his name on the ballot.


